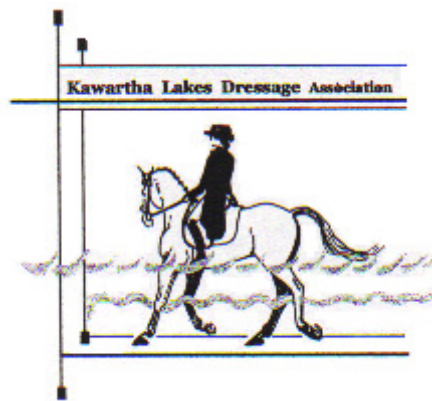

6 EC Bronze Competitions

The Kawartha Lakes Dressage Association Bronze competitions are sanctioned as Bronze competition members of Equine Canada (EC), 2685 Queensview Drive, Suite 100, OTTAWA, ON, K2B 8K2, and are governed by the 2011 rules of EC. Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the 2011 rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC rulebook

NOTE: It is the responsibility of the rider, owner, trainer, coach and parent to be fully cognizant of the 2011 rules and regulations of Equine Canada. Current rulebooks are available for download at www.equinecanada.ca (Section E – Dressage and Section A – General Regulations)

EC Statement of Principles

Equine Canada (EC), the National Federation of Canada, supports adherence to the humane treatment of horses in all competitions under its jurisdiction.

EC is committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities.
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment.
- Ensuring that owners, trainers, exhibitors and their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose.
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, sanitation and safety as a matter of standard operating procedures.
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare.
- Increasing education in training and horsemanship practices.
- Requiring owner, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions.
- Reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of horses.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a reasonable person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition practices, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane.

KLDA 2011 OVERALL BRONZE DIVISION CHAMPIONSHIP & RESERVE CHAMPIONSHIP

These awards will be tabulated at the end of the season and will be presented at the 2011 Annual General Meeting

How to Qualify:

1. Rider and horse's owner must be a KLDA member in good standing on the day of the 1st qualifying score.
2. The same horse/rider combination must attend no fewer than 4 of the 6 shows offered in 2011.
3. Four qualifying scores of 53% or higher, from four different shows and from all three of the tests offered in each division must be achieved
4. The highest scores from each test offered in the division (and from different shows) will be totaled. The horse/rider combination with the highest total of the four (or three) tests will be considered the 2011 Division Champion. The horse/rider combination with the second highest total will be Reserve Champion.
5. For the purpose of division awards FEI Children classes are considered 1st level, FEI Pony is 2nd level and FEI Junior is 3rd level.

‘CAUSE FOR APPLAUSE’ AWARD

This plaque is a lifetime award to be won by an individual horse only once.

- Either the owner of the horse or the rider must be a KLDA member in good standing
- The horse must compete at KLDA Bronze shows at Training Level or higher to qualify for this award.
- Three scores at three different KLDA Bronze shows must be acquired to qualify with;
 1. Two scores of 60% or higher
 2. One score of 65% or higher

The horse with the highest average percentage score will win the award. The winner will receive this very special plaque to be held in the winner's care for one year (only).

SPARTAN III MEMORIAL AWARD

This trophy is awarded to an individual rider competing at any level in the KLDA Bronze Dressage Show Series.

- The rider must be a KLDA member in good standing
- Three scores at three different KLDA Bronze shows must be obtained to qualify with;
 1. Two scores of 60% or higher
 2. One score of 65% or higher

The rider with the highest average percentage score will win the award for the year. A rider is only eligible for this award once.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

The show committees reserve the right to limit entries, divide the classes and govern all conditions of the shows. Neither Kawartha Lakes Dressage Association, nor the show committees will be held responsible for any damage, injury or loss to person, horse or property of exhibitors or spectators.

ENTRIES – Entries will not be accepted unless accompanied by:

1. Photocopies of 2011 OEF membership cards for Rider & Owner
2. Photocopies of 2011 EC Bronze Sport License (minimum) cards for Rider & Owner
3. Your signed waiver (rider, parent (if rider under 18 yrs), person responsible). **ALL OF THESE SIGNATURES ARE MANDATORY**
4. Your accurate and complete entry form
5. Your cheque, made payable to the host stable.

Post-dated cheques will not be accepted. **Entries must be received by the Show Secretary no later than 14 days before show date.**

A \$10 service charge will be charged for all incomplete entries. To be considered complete, an entry received by the show secretary must include all required information, photocopies of all required membership cards and a signed waiver (**rider and person responsible and parent if applicable**). Late entries will be charged a \$10.00 late fee, and will only be accepted at the discretion of the show committee where they may be placed on a 'waiting list'. Any cheque returned by the bank, for any reason is subject to a \$45.00 NSF fee. The NSF fee and entry must be paid by bank draft and further acceptance of any other entries will be at the discretion of the show committee.

ENTRY FEES – are \$25.00 per horse/class. Refer to the KLDA entry form. Cheques are to be made payable to the host stable (as listed in the table below) except the May 29th show at Saddlewood where the cheque is to be made payable to KLDA

HST – Harmonized Sales Tax is payable on all entries at all shows except for KLDA at Saddlewood on May 29th.

CATEGORIES – Those wishing to compete in two categories (i.e. Jr and Open) will pay two entry fees, but may ride one test; the score will count for both categories. If there are fewer than three (3) entries in the Junior category at any level the organizing committee has the option of holding only the Open category.

CANCELLATIONS – Cancellations will only be accepted with a Veterinarian/Doctor's Certificate. Refunds of 100% of entry and stabling fees, less administration fee, will be allowed up until the closing date. Refunds of 50% of entry fees, less administration fee,

will be made after the closing date and before the start of the show. There will be no refunds on stabling fees after the closing date. Scratches after the show starts will lose the total entry and stabling fee.

FREESTYLES – are available at all shows, please notify the show secretary in advance if you wish to do one.

CHANGES TO ENTRIES – Changes to accepted entries requested after the closing date will be subject to a \$10 Entry Change Fee per change of test or division. This fee may be waived at the discretion of the organizing committee.

NUMBERS – All competitors and non showing horses must wear a number at all times in the schooling and exercise areas and in the competition rings. A fee of \$20.00 will be charged for any lost or damaged numbers.

RIDING TIMES – Riding times will be available at www.klda.ca on the Thursday preceding the show date. Ride times will also be available by telephoning the Show Secretary, on the Thursday preceding the show day between 1pm and 9pm.

PARKING – Vehicles must be parked in designated areas only. There is to be no parking on the roads and the barn areas at any time. After unloading, please do not park in the stable area.

DOGS – There will be no dogs allowed on any property at the request of the facility owners.

QUERIES – Questions concerning rules, scoring or entries may be made to the show organizer for discussion with the Organizing Committee. Protests must be made in writing within 48 hours of the completion of the class and accompanied by a deposit of \$50.00, cash or certified cheque. See EC Rules.

WHIPS – May be carried at all shows per EC Rules.

TESTS – May be called at all shows per EC Rules.

RING SIZE – Walk/Trot and Training Level classes will be held in the 20 X 40 ring. First Level and above will be in the 20 X 60 ring.

TACK CHECK AFTER TEST – It is the rider's responsibility to report to the tack check person immediately after the test and before dismounting. **Failure to do so will result in elimination.**

STABLING – Limited stabling is available on request, first come first serve basis.

HORSE/RIDER COMBINATIONS - The same horse must be entered by the same name in all K LDA shows to be eligible for any year end awards. Substituted horses are not allowed to compete with the same name as any other horse shown by the affected rider. With the exception of the Spartan III memorial award it must be the same horse/rider combination that earn scores toward any year end awards.

INSURANCE – All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. Third party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events is necessary.

NON-SHOWING HORSES - There is a \$25.00 per day charge for non-showing horses. Non-showing horses are subject to all the rules pertaining to showing horses.

RIBBONS – Ribbons will be presented to 6th place.

Warm up will be available as posted. Please ensure that you wear your competition number at all times.

DRUG TESTING – EC/FEI Drug and Medications rules apply at these shows. Any horse entered in any class at any competition may, while on the competition grounds, be selected for equine medication control testing. All entries are required to pay a non-refundable \$3.50 fee.

DRESSAGE CANADA LEVY – A Dressage Canada Levy was introduced in 2008. Each entry must pay a \$7.00 DC levy fee.

PERSON RESPONSIBLE: No entry is eligible to compete until the entry form has been signed by the person responsible. **A parent (or guardian) must sign for junior riders/drivers.** It is the responsibility of the competition secretary to ensure that no entry competes until or unless this requirement is met (**EC 2011 General Regulation A801**).

The Person Responsible for a horse is an adult who has, or shares, responsibility for the care, training, custody, and performance of the horse and who has official responsibility for that horse under EC Rules and is liable under the penalty provisions of the Rules for any violation of the EC Rules. **The Person Responsible must hold an EC Sport License (see A203.5).** For the purpose of these Rules, the Person Responsible is normally the trainer, owner or the competitor who rides or drives the horse during an event, or a parent or legal guardian in the case of junior competitors. The Person Responsible is ultimately responsible for the condition, fitness and management of the horse and is alone responsible for any act performed in the stables by himself or herself or by any other person with authorized access to the horse, or while the horse is being ridden, driven or exercised.

HELMETS FOR JUNIOR RIDERS: All Junior riders are required to wear a properly fitted, ASTM or BSI approved helmet when mounted.

NEW HELMET RULE FOR 2011 (As of May 1, 2011)

Article E 4.0 Safety Headgear

1. ASTM/SEI or BSI approved headgear must be worn by all riders competing in the following levels: Fourth Level and below, FEI Young Horse Tests, Materiale and Equitation classes at EC Bronze, Silver and Gold competitions. This rule applies whenever the rider is mounted on the competition grounds.

2. ASTM/SEI or BSI approved headgear must be worn by all non-competing riders mounted on any competing horse at EC Bronze, Silver and Gold competitions.
3. All riders of any age while on non-competing horses must wear protective headgear at all times while mounted on the competition grounds
4. The penalty for contravening 4.0.1 is elimination.
5. Non-competing riders who contravene 4.0.2 and/or 4.0.3 will be instructed to dismount until wearing an ASTM/SEI or BSI approved helmet.

Note: At the tack check which follows the test, the steward may ask the rider to dismount so that the helmet may be inspected for the ASTM/SEI or BSI label.

Every entry at a KAWARTHA LAKES DRESSAGE ASSOCIATION (KLDA) event shall constitute an agreement that the person making it; owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver, rider, and the horse shall be subject to the Constitution and the Rules of Equine Canada, the local rules of KLDA and the facility, and that the owner and/or participant and any of their representatives are bound by the Constitution and the Rules of Equine Canada, KLDA and the facility; accept as final the decision of the Hearing committee on any questions arising under said rules and agree to hold KLDA, the facility, E.C., their officials, directors and employees harmless for any action taken.

I do hereby certify that every horse, rider and/or driver is eligible as entered and agree for myself and my representatives to be bound by the Constitution and Rules of Equine Canada. It is hereby recognized that all equestrian sports involve inherent risk and that no helmet or protective equipment can protect against all foreseeable injury. I hereby accept this risk and hold harmless the E.C., KLDA, the facility, their officials, organizers, agents, employees and their representatives.

I acknowledge that any activity involving horses is high risk including but not limited to:

- (a) the propensity of any equine to behave in ways that may result in injury, harm or death to persons on or around them and to potentially collide with, bite or kick other animals, people or objects;
- (b) the unpredictability of an equine's reaction to such things as sounds, sudden movement, tremors, vibrations, unfamiliar objects, persons or other animals and hazards such as subsurface objects;
- (c) the potential for other participants to behave in a negligent manner that may contribute to injury to themselves or others, including failing to act within their abilities to maintain control over an equine
